
PATHS, PAVEMENTS AND PEDESTRIANS SPECIAL

ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS MADE AT PENGROVE

<u>Good News:</u> A dropped kerb and new bicycle gate have been put in place at Pengrove. This will allow mobility scooters and prams to get on to the riverside path.

After a resident contacted me I arranged for these improvements to be made, with financial help from the *Inclusively Fit* Project as well as Shropshire Council. I will now be seeking funding to improve the whole path as it still has many hazards for mobility scooter users and those with pushchairs.

Many of you were rightly concerned that pavements were not safe during the recent icy and snowy weather. There were many accidents and injuries. Even the main footpaths and pavements around the town centre seemed to be ignored. I have demanded an explanation from the council. We need better service in the future.



Many businesses were affected by the icy pavements and saw a drop in their trade. I've asked for better advice and guidance for those businesses who are willing to clear areas near their premises, but are nervous about whether they should.



COPTHORNE BARRACKS: REPORT FROM THE RESIDENTS' FORUM

In December I held an open meeting for Porthill residents about the proposed Barracks redevelopment . Thanks to everyone who came and shared their thoughts.



I will continue to campaign for a Barracks redevelopment that better serves the local community and doesn't just line the pockets of local developers and the MOD

At the meeting I collected a list of your concerns and comments. I also asked for suggestions of possible uses for the keep: the keep is likely to be preserved and I hope the developers will consider turning it into a community space. Some of your suggestions for the keep include a

local shop, a meeting space for local societies, a walk-in medical centre and office space for local start-ups. I will continue to campaign for a more community-focused development of the Barracks site and especially the keep.
